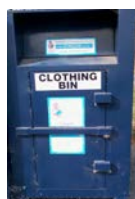

Keep Central Hawke's Bay beautiful

Dispose of waste in the right way and reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill

Animal Carcasses	Classed as special waste, they are accepted at the CHB Landfill. Contact CHB District Council on 06-857-8060 to arrange Landfill access.
Agricultural Chemicals	Visit www.agrecovery.co.nz or freephone 0800 AGRECOVERY 0800-247-326 .
Agricultural Containers	Refer to Agricultural Chemicals. Hawke's Bay Regional Council 0800-108-838 have regular collections of unused chemicals.
Agricultural Packaging	For Silage wrap, bale net, pit covers etc refer to Agricultural Chemicals.
Asbestos 	Refer to the Yellow Pages for an approved Asbestos Removal Specialist. Guidelines for the Management and Removal of Asbestos on www.osh.govt.nz/publications/booklets/asbestos-management-removal . Once asbestos is removed and wrapped it can go to Landfill. Contact CHBDC on 06-857-8060 for access.
Batteries - cars & trucks	They will be worth \$\$\$ - refer to Scrap.
Battery Packs	RECELL LTD 07-542-2533 (they rebuild battery packs for rechargeable equipment). Non-recyclable batteries go to Landfill.
Books, Puzzles & Magazines	Donate your surplus items to CHB Lions Bookarama (details under Events).
Building Materials/ Builders rubble	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Somebody will need broken up concrete or rubble for fill - ask around Small amounts accepted at transfer stations Large amounts accepted at Landfill
Cans - Aluminium/ Steel	Recycle! clean cans and take to recycling drop-off centres for FREE!
Carpet	Re-use or trade. Sometimes used for weedmat in gardening.
Clothing, toys shoes, curtains	Donate to charity and second-hand shops or use Clothing bins (refer to other page)
Computers, Printers	Recycle at the transfer station for a small charge. 
Cooking Oil & Fat 	Please keep fat and oil out of the drains. Prevent blockages - cool fat or oil, then drain into newspaper or bags and dispose into rubbish bags. Tallowman: 06-835-3200
Compost	Watch out for the free annual Composting workshop (details under Events).
Food Scraps 	Organise a worm farm or ask around to see if anyone needs scraps to feed their animals. Last resort - put them out in your rubbish or take to the transfer station.

Furniture & other second-hand goods	Take to Second-Hand Stores or give away in Second-Hand Sunday (under Events). If it's too far gone - take it to the transfer station.
Garden Waste 	Dispose at the transfer station separately as used for compost (small charge applies) or set up your own composting at home.
Gas cylinders	Drop off at the transfer station for FREE
Glass bottles & jars	Recycle. Clean and take to a recycling drop-off centre for free. No lids.
Glass windows, drinking glasses, light bulbs, windscreens	These types of glass cannot be recycled in CHB. Carefully wrap in newspaper and place in rubbish bags for collections or take to the transfer station.
Glasses (Spectacles)	Drop off unwanted glasses in good condition at any optometrist. They are sent around the world for reuse in developing countries.
Hazardous Waste 	Hazardous Waste is any material that is toxic or corrosive, or would ignite or react. This must not be put out for collection or thrown away into the landfill. This includes agrichemicals, cleansers, garden sprays, asbestos, pool chemicals and petrol. HB Regional Council 0800-108-838
Litter 	When walking around town, beaches or anywhere in the district - take your litter home or put it in the bin. BUT if you put household rubbish in litter bins, you may be FINED \$100!
Medical Waste 	CHB Medical Centre, Pharmacies or Doctors may be able to help with your medical waste - there may be a charge. Diabetic and other needles should be disposed of very carefully in approved containers. HB Medical Waste 06-842-2000
Misc e.g. plant pots, fence posts, concrete, wood offcuts, crockery, polystyrene etc	One person's trash is another person's treasure. Try Schools; Kindies; Kohangas, have a garage sale or give away in Second-Hand Sunday (refer to Events). Freephone the Waste Exchange on 0800 NO THROW
Mobile phones 	Return your mobile to any phone retailer or to CHB District Council for Starship.
Nappies	Disposable nappies cannot be recycled. Wrap and dispose in normal rubbish bags. For more types of nappies visit www.thenappynetwork.org.nz

Oil (motor oil)	Used oil is collected at the Waipukurau Transfer Station <u>free of charge</u> and stored in a storage tank.
Paint 	Drop off at the Waipukurau Transfer Station. Where possible, usable paint will be put to one side for use by the Community and the remainder transported to the Enviropaints plant in Otaki to be recycled back into paint. Introductory Offer - to recycle your paint \$1 per can/pail of paint 4 litres and below \$2 per can/pail of paint above 4 litres
Paper & Cardboard 	Recycle! Take to a recycling drop-off centre for FREE! e.g. flyers, glossy magazines, flattened boxes. If you live in Waipawa or Waipukurau, put it out with the kerbside recycling collection.
Plastics Grades 1-6 and 7	Grades 1-6 plastics are recyclable. Grade 7 plastics are not recyclable and will need to be disposed off as waste.
Printer & Toner cartridges 	Check with your printer manufacturer for recycling options or visit the following websites: www.recycleplace.com www.cartridgerescue.co.nz www.croxleyrecycling.co.nz
Scrap 	Scrap dealer: Perrys Panel Beaters & Carwreckers, Coughlan Road, Waipukurau 06-858-9123 . Scrap e.g. Washing Machines, Pipe, Wire, Bike frames, Ovens, Fridges & Freezers (de-gassed), Brass, Radiators, Aluminium pots/ cans/ pans, Steel motors, gearboxes or chassis, Corrugated iron, Motorbike & Car frames, bodies and batteries.
Televisions & small appliances eg radios, stereos, blenders etc	If it is in working order, offer them to friends, students, or the needy. If broken, could be used for parts - see electronic service centres. TV's can be recycled at the transfer stations for a small charge.
Tyres 	Drop off at the transfer station - separate charge applies i.e. additional to other refuse charges.
Whiteware 	If it is in working order - donate to charitable organisations. If it is not working - contact a local scrap dealer (refer to scrap).
