Heads-up Patangata Bridge travellers!

Bridge closed Wednesday 20 and Thursday 21 November, 9.30 am to 3.30 pm

Our teams will be performing a bridge inspection at Patangata Bridge. The bridge will be closed during these times: Wednesday 20 and Thursday 21 November, 9.30 am - 3.30 pm. The bridge will open from 12 pm - 12.30 pm on both days to allow traffic to pass through. We have planned the bridge closure at these times to minimise disruption but we appreciate the detours in place are significant and thank the community for their support and patience. Our teams will be able to accommodate NZ Post on a case-by-case basis and emergency services.

Francis Drake Street Water Renewal Programme

We've started putting a new water main into Waipukurau's Francis Drake Street, adding another chapter into our #theBigWaterStory.

This project involves installing 470 metres of polyethylene (PE) pipe, 445 metres of water rider main and 40 lateral connections (with Acuflo manifolds on each lateral) to the water pipe network.

Currently the water pipe network servicing Francis Drake Street requires regular flushing (three times each week) and maintenance work, costing the council about \$14.5k each year.

This is all being done to: reduce operation and maintenance costs, increase the pipe network's resilience, improve the water drinking quality and increase the number of people we can deliver water to as the district grows.
