Rates relief packages are available to assist local residential, rural and commercial property owners who need additional time to pay their rates due to their financial circumstances.

Rates rebates for 2023/24 of up to \$750 are also available if you are receiving NZ Superannuation or WINZ benefits, or your combined income is within a certain threshold.
