## Waka Kotahi have begun work this week to make Waipawa's main street safer for all!

The installation of raised platforms in existing crossing sites – by the Cenotaph and outside the Four Square in Waipawa's town centre – will have considerable safety benefits. They are being installed following calls from our community for a safer main street. Ideal for areas of higher risk, they will give drivers more time to react to children walking to school, older people crossing the road and others crossing SH2. While raised safety platforms are relatively new to Aotearoa New Zealand, international research has shown they reduce the chances of death and serious injury by around 40 percent. The work is expected to be completed within six weeks. Local businesses will remain open during this period, we encourage you to stop by, grab a coffee and explore the wonderful retail options available.
