## Rubbish bags and Transfer Station Disposal

### Cost Increases will apply from 1 May 2024

Since July 2023, Council has experienced a marked increase in costs to provide waste disposal. This increase is driven by rising compliance costs, landfill operation service costs, and escalating inflation, insurance and interest costs. Council maintains a cost-neutral business model for waste services and can no longer sustain the current prices. Unfortunately, this means we must increase fees and charges to dispose of rubbish. Starting 1 May 2024, there will be a price increase for rubbish bags and transfer station disposal rates.
