## **Exciting news for Madge Hunter Park!**

#### Restoration work has started

We deeply appreciate the support from Waipawa community, especially the children of Waipawa School for their valuable feedback, and the Friends of Madge Hunter Park for their generous contributions. Their efforts in clean-up events, providing a landscape design plan, and fundraising for the park's beautification have been invaluable.

Phase One of the project includes:

- Levelling and reinstating topsoil
- Creating new car parking spaces
- Installing fences
- · Minor repairs to the skate bowl

Council is working with local contractor Cover Earthworks to rejuvenate the park. Please note that the area is now an active worksite. For your safety, please keep clear of the area and respect all safety fencing. The work is expected to take around two weeks, weather permitting. We look forward to seeing Madge Hunter Park restored to its former glory.



#### **Get your permit for Pourerere Beach**

If you're dreaming of a sunny beach camping holiday at Pourerere this summer, remember to apply for your permit by 31 October 2024. There is no payment required for the permit. In line with the Freedom Camping Bylaw approved by the Council in June 2024, a ballot system will allocate campsites at Pourerere Beach Road during the peak season (14 December 2024 - 28 February 2025).

Application is for one site for a stay of up to 14 days. Campsite allocation will be prioritised to Central Hawke's Bay residents. Due to high demand, not all applications are likely to be successful.

Unsuccessful applicants may be placed on a waiting list or offered a campsite at a different time than they applied for.
